## Program Funding

In compliance with the Stevens Amendment, funding details for program year 2022-2023 are provided as follows (Note: this includes carry forward funding from prior program years, as applicable):

- The Community Development Block Grant-Coronavirus Response is supported by the U.S. Department of Labor/Employment and Training Administration as part of an award totaling \$187,965 (25%) and the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development as part of an award totaling \$573,224 (75%), with \$0 (0%) state, local and/or non-governmental funds.
- The Incumbent Worker Training Grant is supported by the U.S. Department of Labor/Employment and Training Administration as part of an award totaling \$200,000 (100%), with \$0 (0%) state, local and/or non-governmental funds.
- The Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act (WIOA) National Dislocated Worker Grant is supported by the U.S. Department of Labor/Employment and Training Administration as part of an award totaling \$984,910 (100%), with \$0 (0%) state, local and/or non-governmental funds.
